The Club is holding its 10th Annual Volksmarch on Natal Day weekend (July 31st to August 2nd) in the Dartmouth/Halifax area. Come out and enjoy one of North America's largest festivals. The volksmarch will take place regardless of weather. Walkers are asked to to obey all traffic/pedestrian signs. Special awards will presented by the executive to deserving participants.

The 10th Annual IVV Volksmarch will start on Saturday, the 31st. of July from the Kinsmen Community Service Centre, 30 Caledonia Road, Dartmouth, Nova Scotia. You may start between 8 and 11 am and are required to be finished by 4 pm. 10k and 20k routes will be provided. Pins and IVV awards available as well as

"B" awards.

The 10k Bridge Walk will commence at 1:30 pm on Sunday, August 1st., from the Findlay Community Centre, 130 Elliot St., Dartmouth and will wind through beautiful downtown Dartmouth, across and through the party on the MacDonald Bridge, viewing picturesque Halifax Harbour and passing along Halifax's historic and event laden streets.

The 11k Parade Walk will commence at 8:30 am on Monday, August 2nd, from the Fairbanks Centre, Shubie Park, Locks Road,

Dartmouth and walk to the parade start point; walk in the Natal Day Parade through Dartmouth to the MicMac Parclo and then return to the Fairbanks Centre. This is a great time to dress like a hiker in your club regalia complete with backpack.

1994 VOLKSMARCH TOUR

Plans are underway for the first organized Volksmarch Tour by the Dartmouth Volksmarch Club scheduled for the spring of 1994. The initial response has been great and it looks like we are going to have a very exciting time.

For those who will be making their first trip overseas, we will be covering a good portion of England and Scotland - Windsor, Oxford, Salisbury, Isle of Wight, Stratford-upon-Avon, the Lake District, Hadrian's Wall, Edinburgh, Perth, Balmoral, The Scottish Highlands, visit a whiskey distillery, York, Leeds, Cambridge, Canterbury, London, and much, much more. For those interested in IVV credits, there's a possibility of doing about 16-17 walks over the three weeks and although most of the walks are in England and Scotland, there will be some in Holland and Belgium as well.

Arrangements are being made by John Lake of Derwent Travel and who also runs the Hit and Run Walking Club in Aylesbury, England. Having received favorable comments on the proposed itinerary, I advised John accordingly and he is now confirming the dates and prices with the various hotels so that he can give us a firm price on the land cost of the tour. Arrangements will then be made with Air Canada to book a block of seats on one of their overnight flights from Halifax to London. By arriving together, John will meet us at Heathrow and our tour will be underway.

I hope everyone who has expressed an interest in this trip has received a copy of the proposed itinerary but if I have missed anyone, please let me know.
